# ADDLETHORPE PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of the Meeting of Addlethorpe Parish Council held on Tuesday
10<sup>th</sup> September 2024 at Poplar Farm Restaurant, Addlethorpe

#### Chairman's Welcome

The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting at 19.30 hours

#### **Public Forum**

There were 4 members of public in attendance at the meeting. One member of public mentioned some fly tipping had taken place on Church Lane opposite the corner of Old Church Road – Clerk to report to ELDC **Action 24/43**. Another member of public mentioned the trees needed trimming near St Nicholas Road & also trees on Old Church Road need lopping and on The Green the low branches require attention.

### **Ongoing Business**

- 45. To receive any apologies for absence: Cllr Stubbins (medical appointment)
- 46. To receive any declarations of interest in accordance with the Localism Act 2011 and to consider any requests for dispensation: RD for items 56 & 58
- **47. To accept the minutes:** the minutes of the Meeting 16<sup>th</sup> July 2024 were accepted as a true record and were signed by the Chair
- 48. Cllr Carole Clark's resignation was noted
- 49. Clerk's Report: Clerk has requested information from LALC regarding the CILCA qualification and is awaiting a response. She informed the meeting about the HMRC penalty which she will appeal as its due to a HMRC software glitch. There is a petition ongoing from Age UK regarding the Government's stopping the pensioner heating payment (apart from those on pension credits) Clerk to sign on behalf of the Council Action 24/44
- 50. To receive reports from outside bodies and from other meetings:

  Cllr Davie wasn't in attendance but he sent a report for the Clerk which was read out at the meeting.
- 51: Financial matters, current:
  - a. accounts paid report:Hand Bros £180 flagpole
    Service charge from bank £18 (quarterly)

    Clerks quarterly payment
    HMRC regarding Clerks payment
  - b. cheques outstanding no usual ones
  - c. expenditures anticipated: grounds maintenance & sign for village green (was agreed LH could arrange @ circ £45)
  - d. bank account balances £12,828.60

#### 52. Planning

- a) Kings Head Static Caravans the caravans seem to be more or less in the correct position and noise is down no further action at this time
- **b)** Bowman's No further action at this time no work going on just collecting samples
- c) Butlins extra caravans These are nearest to Ingoldmells parish but will impact on Addlethorpe so Clerk has put an objection in
- d) National Grid = Check closing date believe was 5<sup>th</sup> September for objections Clerk put an objection in. Further objection to be composed by RD, TC & NT and emailed to Clerk to send in
- 53. No inspection report take off the agenda
- **54.** Traffic calming measures Addlethorpe has joined the Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership and is awaiting the 30mph stickers to arrive. There has been two serious car accidents recently one of which resulted in a fatality. The Council would like three speed bumps on Chapel Lane Clerk to request this from Cllr Davie and also suggest a site visit.
- **55. Footpath Update** Clerk has received notification of receipt of surveys (hardcopy) but no other communication neither has NT heard any more
- 56. Church Lights since the last review of the cost of the lights for the Church the prices have increased. For the full repair and renewal of all lights it is now £2,117 and for the half lights it is £1,400. The electricity running costs are £6.23 per day for the full lights or £3.23 for half the lights (4pm to 11pm). It was resolved that the parish council would contribute £700 towards repairs half of the lights and would pay the electricity when we requested the lights to be on mainly around the Christmas period and possibly other celebration days as occur. Tony Barker was at the meeting and agreed to take this proposal back to the Church Committee.
- 57. Council Meeting Venue a motion was raised to go back to the Church Hall this was passed unanimously with effect from the next meeting.
- 58. St Nicholas Community Space Tony & George from the Church were at the meeting and expressed a desire to research for grant monies to turn the Church into a community area. Possibly grant funding from UKSPF (UK shared prosperity fund) through East Lindsey District Council. RD suggested a group be formed to take this idea forward. It is an historic building so a balance has to be formed between keeping in character and introducing the modern facilities. Clerk to look into funding sources resolved with one abstention. Action 24/45
- 59. Property in Church Lane, complaint the property has been tidied up
- **60. Village Green trees, lopping** it was suggested that this could be carried out by volunteers
